The Life Ed Van has arrived and all students will be engaged in various lessons that deal with a range of health and wellbeing issues over the next two weeks. The units of investigation for each year level are;

<u>Prep / Year 1: Clued Up.</u> The class investigate a range of health and wellbeing issues including identifying safe and unsafe behaviours and environments.

<u>Year 2: Harold's Mystery Tour.</u> An animated video magically introduces students to internal body parts such as the heart and lungs. They explore safety at the park and on the beach, and talk about how people feel in different situations.

<u>Year 3: Harold's Diary.</u> This investigation provides the opportunity to explore relationships and friendships, influences on food choices and the benefits of physical activity.

<u>Year 4: Mind your Medicine.</u> This investigation develops students' understanding of medicines and their safe use, positive communication, strategies for managing conflict, stress, and bullying and explores how feelings influence the choices that we make.

<u>Year 5/6: It's Your Call.</u> This session focuses on improving students' decision making skills by looking at choices, consequences, responsibility, facts, information and influences. Peer influence, cyber safety and cyber ethics are themes used to explore decision making.

Boroondara Region Football Competition

Yesterday the Greythorn Primary School Football team participated in the Boroondara Region Football Competition. It was a round robin event with two 10 minute halves for each game. Greythorn lined up against St Dominics Primary School, Hawthorn West Primary School and Chatham Primary School to decide who would go onto the regional competition.

In bitterly cold weather, with prevailing winds the boys warmed up to face St Dominic's Primary School. Greythorn produced their best passage of football for the year kicking 5 goals and 1 point to set up a very commanding lead at half time. As the games were played in 10 minute halves, Greythorn did a fantastic defensive job in the second half to keep St Dominics to 1 goal whilst also adding another goal to their tally. Greythorn running out victors by 30 points.

With no time to rest, Greythorn then took on the eventual winners of the competition, Hawthorn West. Whilst the game was incredibly close, Hawthorn West, with a couple of late goals, held a lead of 9 points at the end of play. A very close game and a great contest to watch.

Our last game against Chatham Primary School is one of those heart breaking tales where the winner would play Hawthorn West in the grand final. Leading at half time by 6 points, Greythorn were pipped at the post by a solitary point therefore ending their progress in the Interschool Sports football competition. Whilst the team felt a little flat after that game, they can take great pride in the fact that they were the best team in the North Balwyn District, a feat which has not been achieved too many times by the school's football team.

The boys who represented Greythorn yesterday should be congratulated on their performances both yesterday and for the whole season and I have enjoyed coaching this team immensely. You should all be very proud of your efforts and as a coach the most pleasing thing has been the level of improvement and the sportsmanship shown by the team throughout the year.

A special thank you must be given to the parents and family of the team who came to support the boys yesterday as well as the mums, who after the last minute change in times, helped ferry the team to and from the ground. It was very much appreciated.






